MARCH 13 Translation of the Relics of St. Nicephorus, Patriarch of Constantinople Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts (sung on Wednesday)

"Lord I Call..." Tone 1

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> up<u>on</u> You!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an <u>eve</u>ning <u>sac</u>rifice!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

Tone 1 *Idiomelon* (from the Lenten Triodion)

Let us <u>keep</u> a spiritual fast, O <u>breth</u>ren! Let us speak no lies or de<u>ceit</u> with our tongue! Let us <u>not</u> give each other cause for <u>stum</u>bling, but by repentance let the lamp of our <u>soul</u> shine <u>bright</u>ly!// Forgive us our sins in Thy <u>love</u> for mankind!

V. (9) *The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.* V. (8) *Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!*

Tone 1 *(to the Martyrs)*

O <u>Mar</u>tyrs, truly <u>wor</u>thy of praise, although you were dis<u>hon</u>ored on earth, the <u>heav</u>ens re<u>ceived</u> you. The gates of <u>Par</u>adise <u>opened</u> to you, and <u>now</u> you enjoy the <u>Tree</u> of Life.// Entreat Christ to grant us peace and His great <u>mer</u>cy! V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

Tone 3 (from the Lenten Triodion, by Joseph) (Great is the power of Your Cross)

Through the prayers of Your divine A<u>pos</u>tles, O Lord, grant us to spend this time of fasting with com<u>punc</u>tion of heart,// that being saved we may glorify <u>You</u>, O com<u>pas</u>sionate One!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Great and awesome is Your <u>com</u>ing, O Lord, when You will sit in righteous judgment. Despite my guilt, do not con<u>demn</u> me, O God,// but by the prayers of Your A<u>pos</u>tles, <u>spare</u> me!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Tone 6 *(from the Lenten Triodion, by Theodore)* (*Having placed all their hope*)

O A<u>pos</u>tles of Christ,

lights for those born on earth,

rich treasuries of the knowledge of God,

by your holy prayers deliver from temptations us who praise you.

Guide us safely through the course of the Fast,

and keep our <u>lives</u> in peace,

so that we may reach Christ's <u>Pas</u>sion unharmed//

and with boldness offer hymns of praise to our God.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 1 (*from the Menaion, for St. Nicephorus*) (*Joy of the Heavenly Hosts*)

The <u>streams</u> of your wisdom were drawn from the <u>spir</u>itual clouds, pouring forth a fountain of Orthodoxy up<u>on</u> the world. We the <u>faithful</u> draw forth the <u>sweetness</u> from them, and we turn from the out<u>pour</u>ings of heresy// as from the bitter waters of <u>Ma</u>rah.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities. V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

As your <u>most</u> pure body <u>lay</u> in the tomb, it did not decay in <u>any</u> way. It was <u>found</u> to be whole, O most blessed Ni<u>ceph</u>orus. We <u>bear</u> it <u>forth</u> with zeal. We rejoice, fed by the <u>Orth</u>odox faith,// and we bless you, O divinely-<u>wise</u> one!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

The <u>Church</u> which is honored by the name of the A<u>pos</u>tles received you, O most <u>bless</u>ed one, for <u>through</u> your godly deeds, you became a <u>temple</u> of God. After your burial you are again buried in a <u>holy man</u>ner,// and you have buried the foolish talk of the <u>her</u>etics.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 1(Theotokion)

<u>Tossed</u> on a sea of trans<u>gres</u>sions, I flee for refuge to the calm harbor of your suppli<u>ca</u>tions, and cry <u>out</u> to you, O most pure Theo<u>to</u>kos: "Extend your strong right <u>hand</u> to your <u>ser</u>vant,// and save me, O all-blameless <u>La</u>dy!"

Tone 6 Prokeimenon

Be glad in the Lord, / and rejoice, O you righteous! (Ps. 31:11a)

V. Blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven. (Ps. 31:1a)

Reading from Genesis (4:16-26)

Tone 1 Prokeimenon

Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us / as we have set our hope on You! (Ps. 32:22)

V. Rejoice in the Lord, O you righteous! Praise befits the just! (Ps. 32:1)

Reading from Proverbs (5:15-6:3)
